is a family farm in northeast lowa. Our heritage dates back to 1854 when my great-greatgrandparents settled

in a sod house just a mile from our farm. The bison have returned, and we invite you to connect with the land, our family, and our farm.

Tours include an informative lesson on the history of buffalo in lowa and a chance to feed the buffalo. Tours are \$15 for adults and \$10 for children. With an IRSPA membership card or showing your copy of the IRSPA newsletter with the Hawkeye Buffalo advertisement, the cost is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. Tours are set up on an as needed basis so you must call in advance to set up your tour. The Buffalo Ranch is southwest of Fredericksburg next to Split Rock Park and Campgrounds at 3034 Pembroke Ave. Visitors often get a chance to see other wildlife too deer, sandhill cranes, hawks, songbirds, and occasionally eagles. Buffalo meat is also sold on location.

Because buffalo have no upper front teeth, the corn needs to be given to them like you were stuffing a letter in a mailbox.

I arrived at the schoolhouse after the Frontier Days Parade just as Cheryl, in period costume, was beginning to pronounce words for the Kindergartners assembled to spell. She was glad to have a second pair of ears to confirm the accuracy of the spellers. Winners' names were written on the blackboard and they received certificates that Cheryl had prepared. Spellers of all ages were included. After the Spelling Bee, which lasted about an hour, I stayed at the building to share my experiences and



answer questions about my country school days. We really could have used more help and I hope more members will plan to help next year. It's fun to be involved and our

The Jackson County Retired School Personnel met at Clover Ridge on June 3, 2022. A sack lunch from Moore's was enjoyed by all. Randy Meier, Director of "Seniors vs

Crime"/Triad in the Clinton County Sheriff's Office, spoke about scams. He emphasized three main points to remember.



- **1.** Gift Cards are for gifts. Do not buy them to pay for anyone who asks you to do that. A woman from our area was conned into paying \$54,000 after being lured into a romance scam. When you give away the number on the gift card the gift cards are sold and used within an hour. Target and Best Buy are the most common gift cards they ask you to use.
- **2.** Ignore phishing emails and texts. Never call the number that is in the email even if it says your account has been compromised. Never give a stranger access to your computer.
- **3.** Medicare never calls you. It is always a scam if they tell you they are from Medicare, Social Security or the Postal Service. They never call you!!

If you get a check in the mail it is not real. They will want you to pay some back and then your check will bounce. Pay from Western Union is always a scam. Anything unusual, such as being asked to do a wire transfer from your bank, is a scam. A local couple lost \$54,000 due to a Grandparent scam. Do not fall for it when someone calls claiming to be your grandchild in trouble. Don't believe them when they say the disconnect crew is on their way because you have not paid the bill. They get you to pay because they scare you and you are under pressure. Just hang up or ignore them.

The presentation was followed by a meeting called to order by JoEllen Langerman. It was decided that the program committee for next year will meet June 15. In August we will celebrate our 50th anniversary so a committee was formed to plan for that event. Jackson County Retired Teachers was organized in June 1972. The first meeting was on August 4 and Isla Johnston was the first president. The meeting adjourned at 2:30.







VOLUNTEER HOUR REPORT

The lowa Retired School Personnel Association state volunteer hours for 2021 to 2022 will be collected around August 31, 2022. A study by Fidelity Charitable found that last year's volunteer hours were down because of Covid and that 66% of volunteers decreased their time or stopped volunteering entirely during Covid.

The current national value for volunteer hours for 2021 to 2022 will be \$29.95 per hour (\$28.54/hour last year). Our IRSPA hours figured out to equal a value \$6,561,317.46 for lowa's reported volunteer hours.

The volunteer hours collected are reported to the Independent Sector, and The National Commission on Community Service at the federal and state level. We also send our report to the Iowa Commission on Volunteer Service (state), AARP and the NRTA. All of these organizations present reports on statistics that are very important in obtaining grants at the national, state and local levels.

Our local lowa unit Supportive Service coordinators collect the hours and get them turned in to us. Remember that any and all volunteer hours that are turned in will help toward our state's total. We have a few new unit coordinators who will be collecting your hours. If you don't know who your coordinator is, contact your unit President(s).

There is a rumor going around that the emergency ground and air ambulance coverage known as Medical Air Service Association or MASA is in the process of becoming an insurance in the state of Iowa. Will this affect the policy which my husband and I currently are enrolled in and what changes should we be aware of?


Your question couldn't come at a better time. MASA is in fact going to become an insurance program in the state of Iowa. It will fall under the Inland Marine category. This change is actually in the best interest of their clients. The Iowa Insurance Division will regulate all aspects of the business from paperwork, to solvency, to compliance with the law. Unfortunately, with this change comes fees and to offset these fees, there will be changes in the current rates effective October 1, 2022 (the date was originally August 1st). The date was pushed back to Oct 1st to allow clients to consider making changes in their current coverage or to enroll in the MASA program at the current rates.

The rate increase is not exorbitant, but over time will add up and a dollar saved is a dollar earned. People who have the monthly or annual plan have the option to upgrade to a s-year plan at the current rate or, to upgrade to a lifetime plan, eliminating any and all future rate increases.
